

CODE OF ETHICS

These principles are intended to assist members of the Australasian College of Physical Scientists and Engineers in Medicine, individually and collectively, in maintaining a professional level of ethical conduct.

- 1. Members shall always actively promote and safeguard the well-being and interests of the public.
- 2. Members shall act only in areas of their competence and shall carry out all aspects of their work in a conscientious and professional manner.
- 3. Members shall respect the confidentiality of information obtained in the course of their professional duties.
- 4. Members shall provide their services with due consideration to the human dignity and the individuality of the patient.
- 5. Members shall continually strive to improve their professional knowledge and skills, and to share the benefits of their attainments with others.
- 6. Members may advertise their professional services, but will take care to avoid conflicts of interest arising from obligations to their employers and/or clients.
- 7. Members shall be responsible for taking appropriate action in the case of unethical activities of their peers, including the reporting of such conduct to the appropriate authorities if warranted.
- 8. Members shall not make any public statement purporting to be the policy of the College when such is not the case.
- 9. Members shall work in a collaborative and co-operative manner with other health care professionals, recognising and respecting their particular contributions to health care.
- 10. Members shall ensure that any reports, statements or publications produced by them are an accurate and appropriately attributed record of soundly based and adequately researched work.
- 11. Members shall abide by the laws and principles applying to equal opportunity.
